## FROM THE PASTOR

What are you doing to prepare for Easter? This year during Lent our church is offering worship services on Wednesday evenings in the style of Taize. We hope you'll join us.


Taize is a simple quiet way of prayer designed for people of all Christian traditions. The service includes simple chants sung repeatedly, scripture readings, a period of silence, and prayers of praise and intercession.

The Taize community began during World War II when its founder, Brother Roger, arrived in the small town of Taize, France, with a dream of creating a community of peace. He began offering shelter to refugees of the war, especially Jews. Eventually brothers from various Protestant and Catholic backgrounds joined this work and formed a monastic community. Their work eventually evolved into a mission of hospitality and reconciliation for people from all over the world. Today, thousands of guests stay for a

week at a time and share in worship (three times a day), discussion groups, chores and simple meals. Most of the guests are young people seeking God or looking for meaning in their lives.

The Taize community teaches that it is through the heart, in the deepest parts of ourselves, that we begin to grasp the mystery of faith. At our center lies a longing for presence, a desire for communion. This is our desire for God and is the beginning of faith. In worship we nurture and strengthen this desire by supporting one another with our presence and opening our hearts to God in silence and meditation. I hope you will give it a try. Our first service will be on Wednesday evening, February 25 at 7:30 p.m. in the sanctuary.

If you can't make Wednesday evenings, there are other options. We've purchased booklets with daily Lenten meditations and prayers by Henri Nouwen and C.S. Lewis for your personal use at home. You can pick up a copy from the table in the

come to the worship service.

### Highlights from the January 2015 Session Meeting

The session discussed responsibilities and elected officers and committee chairs.

Elder Voreacos reported that the 2014 budget report showed total income for the year was \$248,686.83 and expenses were \$245,058.65, for a total contribution to the operating reserve of \$3,628.18, compared to a projected deficit of \$25,795. Some highlights on the income side were: pledges exceeded the budgeted amount by \$12,135.89; gifts exceeded the budgeted amount by \$10,201; and plate offerings were \$2,496 more than the budget. Spending on maintenance and repairs also was \$2,986.44 less than anticipated.

Session VOTED and APPROVED appointing Anne Stebbins, Maurice Lovell, Peter Shanno and Hiroshi Muto to the Endowment Committee. Elder Voreacos reported that the \$500,000 bequest from the Marie Balsara estate has been transferred to the Vanguard FTSE Social Index Fund.

Elder S. Shanno reported that of the \$740 Peacemaking offering, 75 percent went to the denomination and 25 percent to the Center for Care & Hope (SOS). \$85 was collected from the Thanksgiving Offering and sent to the Center for Food Action. The Christmas Offering of \$924 was split between the denomination's Christmas Joy Offering and the Englewood Hospital Chaplaincy Fund. The Alternative Christmas List raised \$3,105, including \$890 for Center for Food Action, \$535 for Oelhaf House, \$370 for CoFIA, \$620 for Loaves & Fishes, \$490 for Camp Johnsonburg and \$200 for designated youth programs. The congregation also gave gifts to residents of the Oelhaf House.

**Retreat – *Michael Sofia and Pete Shanno*** - Plans and implements one-day or overnight retreats of the congregation.

**Worship – *Michael Sofia*** - Conceives and plans special services of worship, provides for services in the Pastor's absence and for routine tasks, such as communion preparation, reading of Scripture, ushering, and preparation of the sanctuary for worship and special services.



Session Meeting Minutes (continued)

Elder Shanno said the final pledge amount for 2015 is \$157,503, compared to \$146,680 in 2014. The list for 2015 included 50 pledging units, with 20 the same pledge as last year, 15 that increased their commitment, seven that decreased, and eight that were new.

Elder J. Peters reported on the property committee's goals for the coming year. Elder P. Shanno reported extensive steam leaks in the pipes serving the Educational Wing boiler system. The church's HVAC contractor, Glen Anderson, recommended that the church abandon the boiler system and convert the entire wing to a new heating system. Anderson will give an estimate for performing that job after the end of the heating season. Elder Topousis reported that Greenfaith is preparing to do an overall energy audit for our church. The committee also hopes to clean out the basement, the robing room and the nearby hallway.
