
#### FROM THE PASTOR

What an appropriate season for me to be thrown into life with you at The Presbyterian Church in Leonia! New Jersey and New York can really show off the beauty of a vibrant spring, with everyone outdoors absorbing what life has to offer. These two weeks we have had in Manhattan to acclimate before I start my work with you have brought a new adventure each day as well as some opportunity to clear my mind as I jump from one church to another. As I prepare mentally and spiritually for doing ministry with you, I find it quite fitting that our lectionary texts lead us into the season of Pentecost-- the moment when the Holy Spirit fell on the early followers of Jesus, propelling them to form the early Church.

Pentecost is about new beginnings. It is about a variety of people coming together with their different ways of speaking to praise God. Pentecost is about not knowing all the answers, but trusting in the Spirit's power to guide and transform a community. Its symbols are fire and wind, and while I am afraid I do not come with such intensity (or bedlam), I imagine with the children of the church we can cook up some kind of dramatic reenactment to do justice to such a powerful story.

#### PENTECOST CELEBRATION

On **Sunday, May 15** we will celebrate Pentecost, which marks the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birth of the Church. When the Holy Spirit came upon the believers they spoke in other tongues, and people from all over the world heard and understood them speaking in their own languages. Then the disciples began to preach and heal with power, and each day hundreds and thousands of people were added to their number.

We promise a festive atmosphere! Please come and join us. **We encourage you to wear red, orange or yellow**, to symbolize the flames of the spirit. Join us for a fellowship hour after worship.

**Pentecost** (Greek: πεντηκοστή [ἡμέρα], pentekostē [hēmera], "the fiftieth day") is the fiftieth day after Easter Sunday, which corresponds to the tenth day after Ascension Thursday. It is a feast in the Christian liturgical calendar — symbolically related to the Jewish festival of

Shavuot — that commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and the followers of Jesus on that day, as described in the Book of Acts, Chapter 2.

There are more orphans in Uganda than anywhere else in the world — over 2.4 million children — due to the AIDS epidemic, extreme poverty, and decades of civil conflict. Children of Uganda gives over 300 children safe shelter, food, clothing,

education and medical care, from age 5 all the way up to completing their secondary education, vocational training or university. In Uganda, there are no public schools, so without school fees, children can't go to school. Each child who is educated, fed and safe is a strong foundation for peace. 
