FROM THE PASTOR

During Lent we turn our focus to the cross. As we prepare to observe Holy Week and Easter we meditate on Christ's sacrifice and death. We began Lent this year with "Take Up Your Cross Sunday," and each week we have been singing "I see thy cross, there teach my heart to cling..." as part of our response to confession. What is it about the cross that we are supposed to cling to? Why is the cross so important to our faith?

Some people say that by dying on the cross, Jesus paid a debt for our sins. According to this way of thinking, all human beings are sinners and according to God's righteous justice, we all deserve to die. Jesus died instead of us, or for us, and now through him we are able to receive God's forgiveness.

There are a few problems if you take this understanding of the cross literally. Yes, we are all sinners. And you might even go so far as to say we deserve to die for our sins. But the God we worship does not require a punishment in order to forgive. In early biblical times people

offered animal sacrifices for sin, believing it would appease God. But hundreds of years before Jesus was born, the Jewish prophets recognized that God took no delight in animal sacrifice. God is concerned with what happens in our hearts. Psalm 51:16-17 says "...If I were to give a burnt offering, you would not be pleased. The sacrifice acceptable to God is a ... broken and contrite heart..."

God forgave people's sins before Jesus was born. Psalm 103:8-14 says, "God does not deal with us according to our sins, nor repay us according to our iniquities...as far as the east is from the west, so far he removes our transgressions from us." Jesus did not have to die an excruciating death on a cross in order for God to forgive us.

A Christian writer* said it well: "God offers us life and we reject it. God continues to offer it, in the form of love incarnate, and we crucify him. Yet even now, God will not lash out against us but instead raises Jesus up and sends him back with the same offer of forgiveness and life.


