



A NIGHT OF TANGO!

Sergio R. Reyes & Emilio Teubal will return to Leonia Presbyterian Church for a night of TANGO! Save the date, tell your friends! Saturday, November 8th at 7:30pm. \$15 at the door.

SERGIO R. REYES is one of New York City's most sought-after tango violinists. A native of Guatemala City, he studied violin and music composition at Interlochen Arts Academy in Michigan, at the Manhattan School of Music, and at the Brooklyn College Conservatory of Music. He has been part of Forever Tango on Broadway, and has played at Lincoln Center, Carnegie Hall, and other cultural landmarks next to New York-based most prominent Argentine and Uruguayan musicians, such as bandoneonists Héctor Del Curto, Tito Castro, and Raúl Jaurena; pianists Octavio Brunetti, Pablo Ziegler, Gustavo Casenave, Fernando Otero, and Emilio Teubal; bass players Pedro Giraudo and Pablo Aslán. Mr. Reyes has been featured in productions at Pregones Theater, Thalia Spanish Theater, and Tango House, and worked for many years as a performer and consultant for Horizon Concerts, a non-for-profit organization which sponsored free classical music concerts for schools, hospitals, and shelters for the homeless. As a music composer, he has recently written original music for La Mamma Theater's production of 'Luz', a play by renowned playright Catherine Filloux. He has also collaborated with dancer/choreographer Javier Dzul, of Dzuldance. He is also a dedicated photographer, who enjoys photo-documenting --amongst many aspects of New York City's rich cultural life-- outdoor and indoor tango venues throughout the city.

Argentine pianist and composer EMILIO TEUBAL has lived in New York since 1999. He has studied jazz performance, composition, and arranging at the City College of New York. His credits as a Jazz and Tango Pianist include performances and recordings with artists like the Grammy Award winners Raul Jaurena and Fernando Otero, Erik Friedlander, Lisandro Adrover, Miguel Bertero, and Astor Piazolla's legendary violinist Fernando Suarez Paz.

Emilio Teubal has released three albums as a band leader of his own Argentine Jazz Ensemble. His latest album, Musica Para Un Dragon Dormido, released on Brooklyn Jazz Underground Records has been chosen as 2013 best album by several specialized media, and has been placed in the top 100 albums on the digital online store E-Music.

In 2007, Emilio was awarded Meet The Composer's prestigious Van Lier Fellowship, which provides support for talented, culturally diverse young people who are seriously dedicated to a career in the arts.


PARKING

To the Congregation,

Augustine of Hippo once said, "The world is a book, and those who do not travel read only one page." Until recently, unless you count northern Mississippi as another country, I had only read one page. In August, thanks to Suzanne Broffman, Debra Given, and the rest of the congregation, I was able to read another page. The trip to Guatemala was like no other experience that I have had.

As I looked out the window of our descending plane, the first thing I noticed was the country's breathtaking beauty. Quaint buildings dotted verdant mountainsides, and as we touched down in Guatemala City, I was filled with hope at the prospect of the upcoming trip. In no way was I disappointed.

Coming into the trip my goal was to experience another culture. Over the course of the week that we spent in Guatemala, we did that and so much more. I don't think that I could pick one part of the trip and call it my favorite. I just enjoyed everything so much. From exploring the markets in Antgua to wandering Mayan Ruins, the trip was packed full of new experiences. We built a school, with stuffed bottles and concrete, but we also built friendships, with pickup soccer games and late night dance parties.

The most amazing aspect of the trip, besides the delicious food, was the perspective that I feel I gained from visiting Guatemala. I have never really had the chance to see another country. Learning about how other people lived was profoundly interesting. I enjoyed listening to the community member who had fought as a guerrilla in the Guatemalan civil war, and I think that hearing the man speak on his time as an undocumented work in America gave almost everyone on the trip new insight on an incredible important issue.

I wouldn't have been able to do any of this if it weren't for the Church's generosity, and I would like to thank you all from the bottom of my heart for this life-changing experience.
