

FROM THE PASTOR

At our last session meeting, our elders voted to become a supporting congregation of Presbyterian Welcome, an organization that works for the full participation of people in faith communities, regardless of sexual orientation, or gender identity. We have always stated our welcome in our Mission Statement. But now we are taking this additional step. Why now?

Our society is more and more open and affirming of lesbian, gay, bi-sexual and transgender people, and more and more people are "coming out" at younger and younger ages. But people of faith are still divided on the subject. And many are preaching a message of judgment and hate. As a result, religious parents are much more likely to disown children who "come out" to them as gay, and kick them out of their home.* What kind of message does this give these children about God? If they can still believe in God, many of them believe God hates them

This week I read an article that tells the story of a young woman who called her parents from college to tell them she was gay.* Her mother, who is a good Christian and raised her daughter in a religious home responded, "I don't know what we could have done for God to have given us a fag as a child," and then hung up the phone. Later the girl's brother called and said, "Mom and Dad don't want to talk to you, but I'm supposed to tell you what's going to happen." He then proceeded to tell her that her parents didn't want her coming to the house or contacting them in any way. They would no longer pay her tuition, or any other expenses. They were cutting off her credit cards and her phone, and if she didn't return her car to a specific location, they would report the car as stolen. Boom. No more family. This young woman managed to get through college, but she was homeless for part of the time, and often hungry. And she said she thought her suffering was punishment for being gay, and that she deserved it.

In another story from the same article, a nine year old boy asked his Christian mother what the word "gay" meant. His mother explained what it was, and then told him it was an abomination. The boy didn't tell his parents that he realized he was gay. Instead he cried, and prayed for God to make him normal. And his thoughts went like this: "If it's this bad for me to be this way, why did God make me? I wish I were dead."

Can't make it this month, don't worry, the next session is November 8 and we will continue on the second Friday each month.

SEPTEMBER 9, SESSION MINUTES

The meeting opened with prayer at 7:30 p.m. The Rev. Jun Yoshimatsu of the Special Ministry for the Japanese attended. Members spoke with Rev. Yoshimatsu about the status of SMJ since its former director, Rev. Takako Suzuki Terino, moved to New Mexico. The group would like to start weekly services on Sunday afternoons in our sanctuary, once they find a new leader/pastor for the worship services. SMJ offers the only mainline Protestant worship for the Japanese in North Jersey. The Rev. Yoshimatso then left and the meeting continued. Members discussed the SMJ proposal, with several saying the relationship has worked well, has met the needs of Japanese worshipers, and has served as a mission for us. Session VOTED and APPROVED authorizing a proposal to allow the Special Ministry for the Japanese to worship in our sanctuary every Sunday afternoon. On those Sundays when such worship would conflict with our activities by our church, SMJ will meet elsewhere in the building.

Elder J. Peters reported for the Property Committee that they will meet with the architect to discuss bathroom and kitchen renovations and will paint the Fireplace Room. Elder Topousis said the Greenfaith Proposal is proceeding. They will also order a Walker Display System for hanging artwork in the fireplace room. Session VOTED and APPROVED ordering materials and hiring a contractor to install the Walker Display System, which will come from the Pamela Lovell bequest of \$5000.

The Rev. Given reported that the Church Secretary, Michele Ring is now working Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Elder Wilson reported for Worship that the Harriette Coleman funeral drew 150 people. Session VOTED and APPROVED authorizing communion for Sept., Oct., Nov. & Dec. and at the wedding of Jonathan and Virginia Cora. The Prayer meeting will continue every Wednesday night at 8 p.m. Elder Ito reported that registration for ESL classes will be held 9/18 & 23 and classes will begin the week of Sept. 29. The Lunar New Year service will be Feb. 22 and will feature Japanese drums. Elder Broffman reported for the Bingham & Stenken Scholarship Funds that Molly Callahan received a \$500 scholarship. She attends Marymount College. Elder Voreacos reported for the Budget Committee that pledges are lagging the budgeted amount by \$10,808. Elder Phillips reported for the Christian Education Committee that 11 students registered for Sunday school. Joe VanDeWeert prepared a wonderful Sunday School activity based on the books of the Bible and you can see it hanging in the Entry Room. Sabrina Donalies agreed to work in the nursery and Hannah Chen and Mialy Rakotoselson will oversee elementary school children during the service. Elder K. Peters reported for Fellowship that planning for the Holiday Fair has begun. Elder Shanno reported for Mission & Stewardship that the Peacemaking offering will be received on Oct, 5, and 25% will be donated to a local cause. Clerk Voreacos reported that Marisol Seri Hwang, daughter of Eric Hwang and Angie Chung was baptized on June 29. Session VOTED and APROVED Rev. Given's request for vacation November 12-18. The next meeting is Oct. 14. Session VOTED AND APPROVED becoming a supporting congregation for Presbyterian Welcome. David Voreacos, Clerk
