
#### FROM THE PASTOR

"The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it, the world, and those who live in it; for he has founded it on the seas, and established it on the rivers." (Psalm 24:1-2)

From the very beginning of the Bible, our faith teaches that God is the creator of the universe and everything stewards of the environin it. It all belongs to God, everything. And God has given human beings the responsibility to nurture and protect this creation (Genesis 2:15). Yet every year we human beings dump 10 million tons of plastic waste into the sea. choking and poisoning wildlife. We pollute our air, land and water with toxic chemicals, wiping out natural habitats and contributing to global warming. What can we do to be better stewards of God's creation?

We have been doing a few things as a church. For the past year, our property committee has been working with Greenfaith, an interfaith organization that provides resources, tools and assistance to houses of worship, faith-based schools and people of faith across the United States to help them become better ment. Working with Greenfaith, we have assessed our energy use, and are planning to upgrade our lighting and air -conditioning systems to become more energyefficient. We will have to invest some money in this project. But we will save in the end, and it's good for the environment.

We are also teaching our children. This spring they have been learning to care for plants and the earth in Sunday School. Thanks to the leadership of Suzanne Broffman and others, the

#### Family Promise: Keeping Homeless Families Together

This is the 4th summer our congregation will be working at the temporary shelter housed at First Presbyterian Church in Englewood. Our service dates are **Wednesday through Friday, July 1, 2** and 3. The job is to provide dinner for 15 people each of these nights. Two people also stay on site over night, until the guests are picked up at 6AM each morning.

We recommend that 2 people work together to plan, purchase and prepare the meal. Food can either be cooked at home or on site. Cooks will be told a week in advance about food preferences, allergies, etc. Dinner is served at 7:00PM.

Overnight staffers are welcome to arrive in time to eat dinner with the cooks and guests. You will have an air mattress to sleep on but should bring your own pillow and bedding. In the morning you will put out "bag and go" breakfast foods that have been provided in advance. Once the guests depart, you will close up the kitchen before you leave by 6:30AM.

Depending on the ages of the children, activities can be provided. For instance, past summers we have put out sprinklers on the lawn, had movies on the DVD player, and have played games. Extra volunteers, including children, can participate in planning fun things to do.


