"This earth indeed is the very Body of God, and it is from this body that we are born, live, suffer, and resurrect to eternal life"—Father Richard Rohr

As we move toward the great season of Easter, we witness the cleansing rain that coaxes green from tree and earth and brings flower to bloom. The sun warms us in ways that woo us into forgiveness of March's snowstorms. Some complain of idolatry in attaching Jesus' resurrection to the ancient fertility cult festivals of the Mediterranean; even the name "Easter" is derived from Eostre, the Mother Goddess of the Saxon People of Northern Europe.

Personally, I have no problem with this association; in fact, I think it is brilliant! What better time to celebrate resurrection than the time when after we are pummeled by winter and its Nor'easters (pun unintentional)? Ecofeminist theologian Sallie McFague described the earth as God's body; just as God created humankind in God's own image, all of creation also bears the imprint of God. It is vast and at times mysterious, but it also tells us quite a bit of who God is.

And so, let our Easter Alleluias announce a new day for God's creation! We can take part in the resurrection God is expressing through the earth and through our lives this spring. On April 8, some will go up to Camp Johnsonburg for Spruce Up Day and help tend the camp and helping others to have spiritual and recreational encounters in God's natural creation. Several will be going late April to Ecumenical Advocacy Days, where environmental justice will be one of the issues we will lobby our Congressional leaders when we visit Capitol Hill. On April 29, Leonia has a Climate Change March and our church can take part. May God call us to follow Jesus into new life even as we watch the spring coax new life out of winter.

Presbyterian Church in Leonia Mission Trip Dates: July 9-15, 2017.

Campbell Farm is a ministry of the PC(USA). They are located in Wapato, Washington, on the Yakima Indian Reservation.

Cost: The total cost is about \$800-\$1000, depending on airfare costs. However, the church wants to make this more affordable so we are hoping to cover the costs of staying at the service site and our ground transportation, so you would just have to pay airfare (about \$600). Please let Leah know of your intentions ASAP; if you need help with airfare too, the church can help with that.

Work: The Farm can accommodate different ages, including children. We would have some choice in our work according to our abilities. There is always need for handiwork and carpentry on the farm and in the homes of surrounding neighbors. There is also use for people to participate in feeding ministry, childcare, gardening and other farm activities. We are willing to supervise high school aged youth who come without parents—and put them to work!

Context: Wapato has about 95% living at or below the federal poverty rate. The area includes people who are all or part Native American (Yakima) and also Spanish speaking migrants who work the orchards. The Director, Carman Pimms, does a thoughtful job of teaching the history that has contributed to the problems of domestic violence and child abuse, addiction, and poverty that impacts most of the participants in the Farm's programs.

Housing: Workers would stay at the Campbell Farm, and sleep in a house with shared dorm-style accommodations, with several bunks per room.

Spiritual Program: The Farm offers evening reflections where people share prayer and singing as stories are told about daily encounters. The week usually ends with Communion and a traditional native Smudging ritual.

Uganda has suffered severe trouble due to war and AIDS. Many children have lost parents and cannot attend school due to the cost, and many do not have things we consider basic in the United States, such as shoes.

The Presbyterian Church in Leonia is sponsoring a Japanese, Korean & American Garage Sale to raise funds for the Children of Uganda.

The funds raised will be used for school materials, clothing, mosquito nets for the children, medicines, and much more. Representatives from our church have traveled to Uganda in summers past. They have had the joy of seeing how much a donation of ten or twenty dollars can do for orphans in Africa who don't have parents to buy things like socks and sweaters. They fit new shoes on children who had never worn shoes in their life. They watched as children danced around their mosquito nets, making up songs about how they would never get malaria again. 
