Friendship: A Vehicle for the Incarnate Christ

The gospel according to Luke tells us that Mary went to visit her cousin Elizabeth in a Judean town "in the hill country." Like Mary, Elizabeth's pregnancy was a surprise-- in Elizabeth's case, because she and her husband Zechariah were "getting on in years." When the pregnant Mary came and Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, "the child within leaped within her womb." I love to think of what the friendship between Mary and Elizabeth was like, and also the friendship that may have developed between their sons, Jesus and John. I know that friendship gives courage, and each of these people did courageous things to bring forward the glory of God.

Friendship-- the kind that brings forth God's light-- is a sometimes rare gift, and not to be taken for granted. Some collect friends as easily as a lawn collects leaves on an autumn day. But for others, friendship may seem as rare and longedfor as water in the desert.

Church is a place where the seeds of friendship can be found and, with trust, can grow into something rich and beautiful. During Advent, we are offering the chance to form Prayer Partners, and with another person share weekly requests for prayer. Who knows, it may lead you to discover a new friend. We will also open our doors on December 9 for a Community Holiday Singalong; we hope this chance will celebrate friendship among neighbors near and far.

God knows that we humans need each other. And that is the wonderful thing about the Incarnation. God enters our experience in human flesh, as Jesus. Jesus gathers friends-- the disciples, Mary, Martha, and even sinners and tax collectors. Jesus knows the sting of a friend's betrayal in Judas. In Jesus, we find out more about love and reconciliation with God-- but we practice these lessons first with our friends.

May this Advent season bring you good friendship, as well as ways to consider how God's love is made incarnate in the human love you have to offer and receive.


THE CENTER FOR FOOD ACTION NEEDS YOUR HELP

Frozen turkeys, canned white potatoes & yams, boxed mashed potatoes cranberry sauce, pasta and pasta sauce, rice, pancake mix, syrup, 100% juice, canned fruit, cake mix and icing, coffee and tea, supermarket gift cards to purchase turkeys.

	Amount of Gift
1. Ce r	nter for Food Action provides a food pantry for emergency assistance, nutrition and budget counseling for individuals and families. CFA also provides advocacy services for hunger-related issues and assists clients in providing funding for housing and utilities. \$
2.	Family Promise Unlike many housing programs, this shelter accepts both children and adults, and male and female guests—which enables families to stay together during a crisis. Case managers help families achieve financial independence. Our church helps host the shelter in Leonia 3 weeks/year. \$
3. Cor	mmunity of Friends in Action is a group of volunteers from the community, churches and synagogues that works with immigrant day laborers in the area. Currently they run a Monday program at noon at a church in Palisades Park that provides lunch and speakers on various topics such as worker rights and community relations. They also provide evening English classes, a workers' link program and assistance in collecting unpaid wages. \$
4.Loaves and Fishes is sponsored by the Englewood, Leonia and Teaneck Cluster Churches and is located at Bethany Presbyterian Church in Englewood. They serve a weekly hot meal and send clients home with a light bag meal of a sandwich, fruit and snack. \$	
5.	Camp Johnsonburg is the Presbyterian Camp and Conference Center located in western NJ, an hour's ride from Leonia. Our church has enjoyed Camp Johnsonburg for the past 30 years or more and many of our young people have been campers and/or counselors. \$
6. Fir	st Friends of NJ and NY upholds the inherent dignity and humanity of detained immigrants & asylum seekers through volunteer visitation, resettlement assistance & advocacy. In the current climate of hostility around guests to this county, we have the opportunity to offer instead support and hospitality. \$
7.	Zoe's Place is a safe residence for women under 21 who are pregnant or mothers with their young children. It is under the direction of Children's Aid and Family Services of NJ. \$
8.	Mission Trip Support this summer our church will spend a week serving a Sister Jean's Kitchen, a Presbyterian mission that serves 150-350 hungry people daily in Atlantic City. Volunteers may also help with home and building repair in the aftermath of Superstorm Sandy. \$
