Reducing Gun Violence

As we journey through Lent, we are called to investigate the demons in our lives. There is a demon that this country has allowed to live among us in comfort. It is a demon that has taken the lives of innocent people; it is a demon that allows for child sacrifice; and it is also a demon that helps those in despair take their own lives. The demon is that of gun violence.

The Mission and Stewardship Committee decided at its February 21 meeting to put a spotlight on gun violence, and following the words of the Prophet Isaiah, to use our faith to "beat swords into plowshares" (Isaiah 2:4). Before the committee came to this decision, at the Leadership Retreat earlier in the month, both Elders and Deacons identified gun violence as a concern they would like



our church to address—and this was before we saw yet another shooting in Parkland, Florida. Children and teachers deserve to learn together in schools that are safe from violence, and protecting them is one way we live up to our baptismal vows as Christians.

Each Sunday in March, there will be a bulletin insert with 2-3 facts about gun violence, followed by 2-3 action items you can take—sometimes from your own desk. For those who want to offer a physical witness, you can support the Leonia High School walkout on March 14 at 10 am; this effort needs to be student-led, but adults from the church can show support by standing in solidarity and making signs with messages such as "We Are Listening to our Youth!"

Also, on March 24 there will be busses going to New York City, Newark, and Washington DC for the March for Our Lives to prevent future mass shootings and other forms of gun violence by enacting smart gun legislation; I will be on one of those buses but am deciding which one. To me, it is fitting that these marches happen the day before Palm Sunday, when we celebrate Jesus' humble entry into Jerusalem as a contrast to the Roman Emperor's procession marked with the tools of violence. 

She was hired by an assisted living facility in Minot. Don't worry, I had never heard of it either. She shares an apartment with another woman from Rwanda, but the roommate grew up in America and Chantal says, "She doesn't talk like me. She sounds just like you. So my English has improved a lot." The day we spoke it was -20°F and Chantal described it as terrible. She says her job is lovely and she is very happy doing it. She misses all of us in New Jersey.

For people in the congregation who barely remember or think they remember Chantal, she lived in Leonia with an aunt and uncle working for the Rwandan government. She had been involved in the Rwandan genocide and had frightening stories. She's a beautiful woman, but her English was poor and she therefore was isolated and we did not get to know her very well.


