When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind..."

During May, we celebrate Pentecost Sunday, which is the day we remember the Holy Spirit descending on the early followers of Jesus. The Holy Spirit came in like a rush of wind and accompanied them, as the Acts story describes, with tongues of fire, so that of the international crowd surrounding them, "each one heard them speaking in the native language of each."

One sign of the Holy Spirit is that, as we see in the diversity of languages it brought to the early church, its gift is meant for all people. The Holy Spirit crosses the boundaries of country and language, class and gender, wealth, and ability, as we open ourselves to the gifts the Spirit brings. The Holy Spirit is busy at work getting us ready for Pentecost leading up to Pentecost Sunday, May 20. Our lectionary readings from scripture give hints of the Holy Spirit's arrival.

And on May 6, we celebrate Confirmation Sunday and will lay hands on our youth making their confirmation, as a sign of the transferring of the Holy Spirit on them. That same day, we will have 9 adults joining the church! That is so amazing for a church of our size. It wouldn't happen if this were not a place that is open to the winds of the Holy Spirit as they shape us, and offering a welcome that crosses borders. The people joining us speak of the warmth they feel from the congregation, as well as a sense of discipleship where they believe their faith can grow. Our new members are a gift, and the body of Christ is made richer by their presence.

Lilly has made the art for the bulletin. Leo will share his music. The Confirmation mentors will help as liturgists. By the end of May, we hope to have collected background checks for all teachers, confirmation mentors, and nursery workers in supervisory role of children and teenagers, as part of our new Child Protection Policy. Please note that we have also invited the Session to do these background checks so that we have a strong pool of potential volunteers with our kids—but it is not required to do this check to be on Session. We are also looking for teachers for the fall of 2018, for our three Sunday School classes and for working with our teenagers. Volunteers need to have been an active part of our church for at least 6 months, pass the background check, and agree to our Child Protection Policy. Garage Sale to benefit Ugandan Children in Africa

Japanese, Korean & American sellers

Uganda has suffered severe trouble due to war and AIDS. Many children have lost parents and cannot attend school due to the cost, and many do not have things we consider basic in the United States, such as shoes.

The Presbyterian Church in Leonia is sponsoring a Japanese, Korean & American Garage Sale to raise funds for the Children of Uganda. The funds raised will be used for school materials, clothing, mosquito nets for the children, medicines, and much more. Representatives from our church have traveled to Uganda in summers past. They have had the joy of seeing how much a donation of ten or twenty dollars can do for orphans in Africa who don't have parents to buy things like socks and sweaters. They fit new shoes on children who had never worn shoes in their life. They watched as children danced around their mosquito nets, making up songs about how they would never get malaria again. Sellers will donate all or a portion of their sales towards our fundraiser.


