

"Prophesy to these bones, and say to them: O dry bones, hear the word of the LORD. Thus says the Lord GOD to these bones: I will cause breath to enter you, and you shall live." -Ezekiel 37:4-6

The prophet Ezekiel received this word from God, and it was a metaphor for the new life God would breathe into a people that were hurting and in exile. I have a confession to make: my sister and I still have not found a permanent resting place for the ashes of our mother, who died 4 years ago. For the time being, my mom's ashes have been tucked into a corner of my sister's bedroom. To be honest, my mom probably would not have minded her cremains being so close to my sister, and near the playful antics of her grandson she loved so very much. Even though Alice and I do want to find a final resting place, the task hasn't taken on an urgency because we know her spirit is no longer with her body; it is with God, and it lives on with us. I have been thinking lately about the history of people who have served our church and gone on to be with God. I will not be visiting their graves. However, I do think of them every time I hear the heat turn on, knowing that our boiler and heating pipes were replaced using money from gifts that were left to the church by these saints. I remember them when I hold an event in the Fireplace Room, which was remodeled using money from the church endowment. On November 5, we will have a luncheon where people can learn more about making gifts through their wills that will help others enjoy the church for generations to come. I see these gifts as one way our spirits can live on in a very physical way, in the church.

And we do not have to die to let our gifts bless the church. Stewardship Sunday is on November 12, and I hope each household will prayerfully consider making a pledge. Your money helps the ordinary yet amazing functions of the church: the unison crinkle of a page turn when newer English speakers and the harder-of-hearing follow a sermon, and the squawk of a baby interrupting a meditative silence reminding us that the church is still becoming and will live on beyond our years are possible because your money helps host these delightful activities.

On November 19, we will light candles and speak the names of loved ones who have died as we remember them. On the same day, we will baptize baby Sebastian Lehnbeuter, whose smile has already made an imprint on the hearts of this congregation. What other place—beyond the extended family—unites the generations from birth to death, and even beyond death? Thank you for what YOU bring to this community of faith. It wouldn't be the same without you!






