Eucharistic Living

In our Presbyterian church, we usually celebrate the Eucharist—the sacrament also known as Communion, or the Lord's Supper—once a month, plus on our high holy days like Christmas Day. But even though we only share this sacrament once a month or so, unlike the Episcopal or Catholic church where it's shared every week, the sacrament shapes us every day of our Christian lives.

When we take communion, we share a little chunk of bread with a small bit of juice or wine, and it is not only a remembrance of Jesus' last supper with his disciples; it is a sign of Jesus present among us, the church, in body and in blood. What fine imaginations we Christians have, that a crumb of bread and a thimble-full of juice can become something so glorious! But it takes a good imagination to be a Christian, for we must try to imagine the world as God sees it, and then our work as disciples of Jesus is to help bring that vision to life here on earth.

The vision Jesus gives us at the communion table is one where everyone is welcome, and everyone is fed. How do we do that at the church? Well, on November 2, we will have a Progressive Dinner. We will share a meal together, starting with appetizers at the church, then splitting off into 4 different homes for an entrée in groups of about 8 people, so that we can be small enough to enjoy meaningful and fun conversation, but big enough to be stretched beyond the people we already know well. We will come back for a shared dessert. Even the kids will have a group that will enjoy pizza, games, and movies at the church. Ours is not a church that encourages people to remain anonymous, unknown. We hope this meal will make us all feel more connected to one another.

Eucharist also teaches us that all the hungry should be fed. Jesus' first public speech was reading the scroll from Isaiah, beginning with "I have come to preach good news to the hungry." He shared that good news by multiplying just a few loaves and fishes into a feast that fed thousands. We are heirs to that work, and so we support programs like the Center for Food Action on November 17, and Loaves and Fishes on November 24, both programs that help our community by making sure that no one has to go hungry.

Thanksgiving is just around the corner, and it is a holiday of feasting. Even though it is not a specifically a Christian holiday, we can bring our Eucharistic values to the feast, being mindful of the One who brings us together to table, and the earth which God created and which blesses us with good food. We remember, and we give thanks.




