

## **Stewardship Season Begins!**

This Sunday we will kick off our Stewardship Season for 2025. Our theme is, "Choose This Day!" and is taken from Joshua, asking the Hebrew people who have wandered in the wilderness for 40 years, to recommit to the covenant they have made with God. He says to them, "Choose this day whom you shall serve!"

We are pretty pro-choice around PCL. And we know as much as it is a choice (if you are a US citizen and over 18) who you may vote for in the November elections, it is also a choice whether or not to come to church on Sundays.. It is a choice whether or not to try to follow Jesus. It is a choice whether you will use your life and resources to pursue peace. Making a pledge is a choice, and doing so is helping to choose a church with the kind of resources that can creatively and faithfully live out Christ's call in these specific times. Many things call out, "choose me!" when we consider how we might budget our money. What will your budget say about choosing God?

Our first Stewardship speaker will be Jose Falcon, with his Deacon Linda McGarry bringing his words to you, since he usually does not come to church due to some physical and mental disabilities. Jose, who is on a fixed income, gives \$5 to the church when he can. He wants the congregation to know that "anybody can give!" and his Deacon will share that message on his behalf. Pledge Dedication will be Nov. 17 or anytime before.

Our scriptures for this Sunday are Job 38:1-7, 34-41 and Mark 10:35-45. The sermon will be called "God of Great and Small."
