Sermon Title: Goldfish Memories

Psalm 138 1 Corinthians 15:1-11 Luke 5: 1-11

Introduction

Good morning, dear friends. Today, as we gather amidst a mix of emotions, we honor the cherished memories of our beloved pastor while also confronting the uncertainty that lies ahead.

I want to acknowledge and thank you for your commitment to her, her family, and the greater body of Christ. Your dedication speaks volumes about the warmth and love within this community. In this passage, we discover a teachable moment where the limits of human understanding intersect with the boundless potential of faith. As we embrace our own "deep water" moments, we learn to trust in God's wisdom and open ourselves to the transformative power of divine guidance.

Now, let us turn our attention to a heartwarming children's book titled "Subway Story" by Julia Sarcone-Roach...
