Guest Preacher THIS SUNDAY (MAR. 15)



This Sunday, we welcome our guest preacher, **Rev. Dr. Grace Nzameyo**. She was born in Douala, Cameroon and grew up in Kribi in the South Shore community area of the capital, where she was raised in a conventional Presbyterian parent home. After graduating from high school as salutatorian, she went on to major in Mathematics and Political Science at the Yaoundé University in Cameroon.

She enrolled at Rutgers University Business School, Newark, and graduated in 2004 with a Bachelor of Sciences degree in Finance and Accounting. After graduating, she worked as an associate in marketing and intellectual property at PNC Bank and as a Financial Analyst at American Express. She went on to work as a Program Monitor for Hudson County Department of Family Services in 2006.

In 2006, Rev. Dr. Nzameyo enrolled at Drew Theological Seminary where she obtained her Master of Divinity degree. She was ordained as a Minister of the Word and Sacraments in 2018, and in 2021 obtained her PhD degree from New Brunswick Theological Seminary.

Rev. Dr. Grace has three children, Franck, and Ines (twins), 27, and baby Grace, 20, and they live in Newark, New Jersey.
